GUIDELINES AND REQUIREMENTS FOR IOWA YOUTH TOUR JUNE 14-20, 2026

Iowa's locally owned electric cooperatives have been sending high school students to Washington D.C. every June since 1958! On the week-long tour, students learn about electric cooperatives, American history and U.S. government and walk away with a greater understanding of their role as an American citizen. They participate in National Youth Day, visit with their elected legislators, and explore the sights around the nation's capital. High school sophomores or juniors with a passion for government and public service are encouraged to apply.

Approximately 40 high school students are chosen by local electric cooperatives from across the state of Iowa every year. The Iowa students join with more than 1,800 students from co-ops around the country for the national Youth Tour in Washington D.C. in June.

Students are selected for this program through the overall strength of the applicant. If you want to take advantage of this incredible leadership opportunity, please complete this application and return to Guthrie County REC by **February 2, 2026**.

1.) Youth Tour applications are open to all high school sophomores or juniors within our service territory-members and non-members in these school districts: AC/GC, ADM, Audubon, CAM, CR-B, DC-G, Exira-EHK, Panorama, Perry, WCV, and Woodward-Granger.

2.) Three semi-finalists will be selected for an interview at the Guthrie County REC office.

3.) The winner will be **required** to attend two Guthrie County REC board meetings: the April or May board meeting before the trip, and one board meeting after the trip; complete a job shadow with Guthrie County REC personnel in April or May before the trip; and give a presentation of their trip at the Guthrie County REC Annual Meeting in January 2027.
